Dr. Connors received her undergraduate degree from the University of Pennsylvania and her medical degree from the Pearlman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. She completed her residency in OB/GYN at the Christiana Care Health System where she earned several awards including the most outstanding resident surgeon, most outstanding resident research, and the Donald F. Richardson Prize from Region III of American College of OB/GYN. In addition, Dr. Connors completed her fellowship in Maternal Fetal Medicine at Wake Forest University Baptist Health and later earned an MBA with honors from the Wake Forest University School of Business.

After completing her fellowship, Dr. Connors served as an Assistant Professor at the Wake Forest University School of Medicine where she supervised MFM fellows, OB/GYN residents, and medical students.
